Stanly Technical College received a \$45,000 grant recently from the North Carolina State

Board of Community Colleges for the establishment of a Small Business Education Center Eight centers are already established and Stanly Technical College is one of the six newly selected sites.

In his new position, Mr. West plans to develop a comprehensive Information Resource Center dedicated to identifying collecting and disseminating information to be utilized by small business operators. Currently there does not exist in Stanly County a centralized collection of local statistical data which is essential in researching and developing potential small business ventures.

Mr. West will conduct a research effort to develop an inventory of all local facilities available for use by new and expanding small business and an intensified effort to target and provide services to the "special needs" population of small business operators in Stanly County, specifically minorities, women and older citizens will also be implemented.






